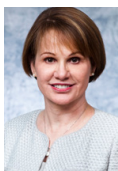

The University of South Florida Sarasota-Manatee (USFSM) became the second regional institution in the USF System to be separately accredited in 2011, and enjoys the prestige of a nationally ranked research university with the convenience of a hometown location, including classes in Manatee County, in North Port and online. In response to community needs, USFSM welcomed its first freshman class in 2013, and is now building student life for the enjoyment of all four years of undergraduates on the beautiful Sarasota-Manatee campus. USFSM is growing its Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) offerings, including a new bachelor of science in Biology, as well as a robust core curriculum of general education courses.
