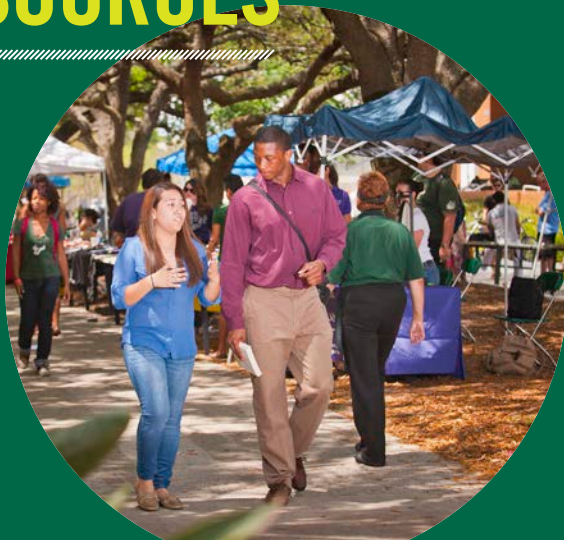

The E-MBA has been ranked by U.S. News & World Report as #37 best in the nation and #2 in Florida. The campus is also host to its own chapters of 10 national academic honor societies.
